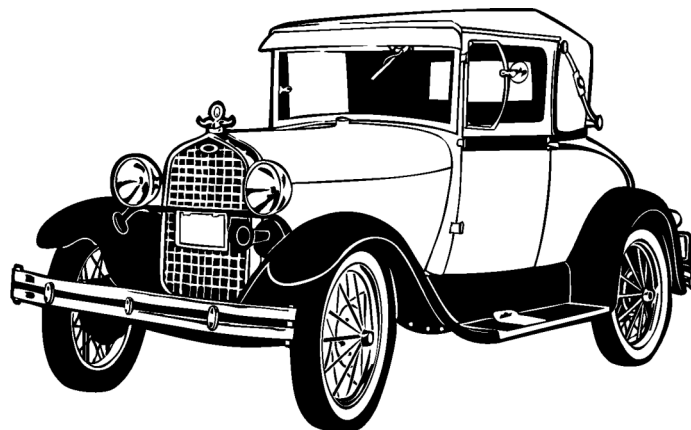

October Outing Oct. 24-26, 2013 Pimeria Alta Tour

Thurs: We will start at the Hotrod Café at Houghton Road and Mary Cleveland Blvd. at 11:30. Following lunch and a chance to see cars being restored, we will leave at approx. 1 PM.

We will drive up SR 83, to Sonoita, where we will have a break for gas and restrooms, then depart at approx. 2:15 PM via SR 82 for Patagonia.

At Patagonia we will meet up with members from the Sierra Vista and Nogales clubs. We have the choice of either taking a short trip to Harshaw, a ghost town, or visiting the Patagonia-Sonoita preserve. We will depart Patagonia at 4:30 PM.

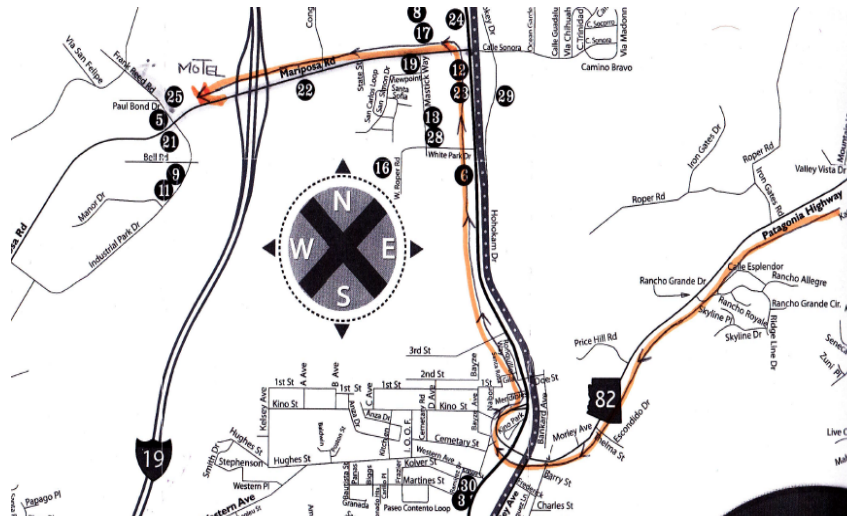
Note 1: for Border Patrol we need list of attendees, citizenship, DOB, Nationality. If the gov't shutdown precludes this activity, another activity will be substituted.

The following recipe was requested by several members after the Mt. Lemmon outing in August:

Overnight Coffee Cake

Linda Kent

2 c flour
2 T powdered milk (optional)
1 T Cinnamon
½ t salt
1 t soda
1 t baking powder
Mix together and set aside.

Cream the following together:

1 c sugar
½ c brown sugar
2/3 c shortening

Add 2 well-beaten eggs to sugar mixture and mix well.

Alternately add 1 cup of buttermilk and the flour mixture to the sugar mixture and blend well when all is added. Pour into a 9x13 lightly greased and floured pan.

Topping:

½ c chopped pecans
½ c brown sugar
½ t nutmeg.

Mix together and sprinkle over coffee cake. Cover and refrigerate over-night. Bake at 350 degrees for 35 – 40 minutes. I like to make this on Christmas Eve and bake it on Christmas morning. This can be also be baked right after it is made.
