

Torie is black with Apple Green wheels (wheels are a bit brighter than the original Apple Green). Newer Mohair interior. There is no pinstripe. The paint has various flaws, so it will need a bit of work including touching up, rubbing out and waxing. On the top of the gas





tank it appears as if a previous owner tried to buff out the paint at one point. The rear floor pan has been patched, but I have a good rear pan that goes with the vehicle. It's a reasonably easy replacement. Dome light is in place but the on/off button is missing from the passenger side B

pillar. Driver's seat adjustable with bars, so Torie is an early production Victoria. She's been parked in a garage for some time, so she will need





the gas replaced and other common sense things done to get her running happily again. Mechanically she will need some tweaking, but should make a great driver. Unfortunately, I don't know any of her history. \$17,250.



1930 Sport Coupe and Original Tools

I have had a good time with this car but it is time to move on. I hope to place it with someone that would enjoy and take care of it. I am asking \$9000.00 for the car, and I also have a complete set of original tools in a display case for \$500.00. A few misc. Model A books and parts come with the car.





1. Car is painted Vermillion, a color Ford had in 1930 but only as a stripe. 2. I believe the





seals in the transmission and rear end leak. 3. The engine was completely rebuilt in about 1970. The pistons are 0.080 oversized. The clutch was replaced at that time. I don't know if the crank was ground at that time but it's more than likely because a rod had loosened up. 4. There is no rust in the car. I bought the car in Albuquerque. 5. The fenders are all original. 6. The running boards and splash aprons are reproduction from about 1970. 7. It will include a car cover and a sixvolt battery tender. 8. The top and interior came from LeBaron Bonney. 9. It has original shocks but the connecting arms are "doggie bones" and probably need rebuilding. 10. The radiator seems to be OK, but I have not driven it more than 15 miles at any one time since we moved to Tucson. 11. The lower left front molding had a hole there and when I restored it I just filled it with bondo. It is showing some deterioration. 12. The lights are all original. 13. The gas gauge float and sediment bulb have been replaced and a strainer installed in the gas tank. 14. I had the doors and rumble seat lid sandblasted when I restored the car. The doors and lid were stretched. I beat the doors out and used some bondo on them. The rumble lid still has the 3 circles that were stretched.

15. The frame is not the original frame. The original frame had the front, where the bumper bolts on, broken off so I put a different frame under the car. **16.** The paint is showing its age, it has chips and cracks. It is nitrous cellulose lacquer. **17.** The tires were installed in 1970 and look good but probably should be replaced before any serious driving. **18.** The speedometer was replaced. **19.** It has an electric windshield wiper. It should be vacuum. I have a vacuum wiper along with the piping. **20.** It has an Otwell heater exhaust manifold. I have an original manifold. I have a heater door for the firewall but I never installed it. **21.** Engine head is a Ford script head. **22.** 4 bladed fan installed. I have a 2 bladed fan. **23.** I have a tow bar for a Model A. Take the front bumper off and bolt the tow bar on. Used to tow the car from Albuquerque to Maryland in 1974. **24.** Fused electrical system. **25.** It includes a car cover. This is the good, the bad, and the ugly about the car. It does run well and starts right up even after sitting for a while.




