San Xavier Mission Tour Saturday October 26

October 26th was a picture perfect day in Tucson for our monthly outing. Because the Asarco Mine was on strike, a short run to the San Xavier Mission and lunch at the America Eat Company was suggested as an alternative.





Eighteen members, driving 10 Model A's, 2 Model T's and 2 modern cars, met at the Desert Diamond Casino parking lot and took a short drive to the Mission through the Tohono O'odham Indian Reservation, past agricultural fields along the Santa Cruz River that have been farmed for literally thousands of years.

We took a leisurely walking tour of the Mission, the oldest historical site in

the Tucson area. The original mission was founded in 1692 by Padre Kino in the center of the settlement of the Sobaipuri O'odham, on the southwest side of Tucson along the banks of the Santa Cruz River. The mission that survives today was built between 1783 and 1797, which makes it the one of the oldest structures in Arizona. It is a well-preserved example of Spanish Colonial architecture in the United States. However, the right side tower was never completed (continued on next page)





All in all, we drove our Model A's about 500 miles on this tour with only a few minor mechanical issues, and everyone returned home to










either Tucson or Colorado safe and sound.


This was a tour that aptly fits the expression "you just had to be there" to appreciate the beauty and grandeur we saw.

STEERING GEAR LUBRICATION




