Overnight Trip to Globe Friday March 27 — Sunday March 29

The tour will leave the paved parking lot just north of the Sunnyside Cafe in Catalina at about 9:30 AM. We will follow Arizona 77 past Oracle and Mammoth, 36 miles to our first stop at the Aravaipa Creek bridge. This is about where Aravaipa Creek joins the San Pedro river and is the site of several historical events. There are no facilities. Note: our speed will be limited to 45 miles per hour.

Then we will proceed to Winkelman for fuel, break, checkup, and bathrooms. Following this, we will drive through the mostly abandoned mill and smelter towns of Hayden and San Pedro.

Returning to Arizona 77, we will continue north, stopping at the rest area at the top of Pinal pass (5000 ft) for a break and picnic lunch. We will then drive to Globe and the motel check-in. We recommend the Best Western at \$110.77 total per night. Denny's is right next door for late night snacks, and there is free wine tasting right across the street. Alternatively, the Days Inn is across the road, and the rate is \$89.27 per night. Dinner will be on our own at one of several excellent Mexican, Italian, and American restaurants close by. Apache Gold Casino has an excellent seafood buffet starting at 4 pm as well. Miles driven for the day should be 110.

Saturday morning we will take the walking tour of the Old Dominion Mine, mill, and smelter site (1880 to 1931). Walk as much or as little as you like, as it is a self guided tour. Following this we will visit the Besh-Ba-Gowah Archaeological Park and Museum. Lunch will be at La Casita Mexican restaurant. The rest of the afternoon we can visit the many antique shops and historical downtown, including the Gila County courthouse and jail. The Pickle Barrel is the best-known antique shop, and is famous for its Turquoise. Dinner is on your own with choices like Copper Bistro, Bloom (Asian), Judy's Cookhouse, La Casita, De Marco's (Italian) and more. Apache Gold Seafood Buffet is available as well.

Sunday morning we can visit Apache Gold Casino, drive to Coolidge Dam (30 miles), or whatever we decide. Or we can just head home as a group.

Please just call me if you wish to come along. We would love to have you.



New Model A Engine Update

This is an update to the article in the September 2019 issue of our newsletter, describing the efforts of MAFCA member Terry Burtz to manufacture new Model A engines. Below are excerpts from his January email update. The full email and other details are available on the project website listed below.

Jan 2020 New Model A Engine Update

Hello to All,

Updates

New Engine

This project started in 2007 and stalled in 2015 because of sky-rocketing cost and the lack of quality control at foundries in California. Previous updates, pictures, and videos can be found at <u>www.modelaengine.com</u>. I use the term "new engine" loosely because the only new parts are the cylinder block, crankshaft, and connecting rods. All interfaces for mating parts are identical to original and have been documented from original Ford drawings. In the 2 July 2019 update, I was happy to state that the project was resurrected and I would be working with others (John, Leonard, and Bill) to have the "new engine" manufactured in China.

A lot has happened since the last update on 26 Nov 2019. As mentioned before, the cylinder block and main caps will be manufactured in one factory and the crankshaft and connecting rods will be manufactured in another factory. Both factories will be working together so that there are no conflicts.

Cylinder Block and Main Caps

SolidWorks models of all internal cores, main bearing caps, machined surfaces, an original cylinder block, and the one good cylinder block from Lodi Iron Works were provided to the factory in China and the instructions were to follow the machined model exactly, revise the internal cores if needed and to use a laser scan of the original cylinder block for the exterior. The machined surfaces drawing made from my SolidWorks file is close to being acceptable. One more iteration is needed because their fore and aft tooling holes need to be moved inward.

New Model A Engine Update

During December, I asked to review and markup the 3-D model of the exterior cylinder block created by the engineers in the factory we are using. Unfortunately, many small details did not look right, and it became obvious that the factory was attempting to model the cylinder block exterior using 3-D drawing instead of laser scanning.

To get the exterior of the new cylinder block correct, John has contracted with CAM Logic Inc., located in Oxford, MI to clean up the laser-scanned file of the original cylinder block. This cleaned up file will then be used to create the exterior pattern for the new block. The first 2 figures show the laser-scanned cylinder block. The next 2 figures are of a model from CAM Logic that will be used to create the pattern. CAM Logic will also combine the core assembly with the laser-scanned model to verify exterior wall thickness.

Unfortunately, the timing of these design changes along with the Chinese New Year is going to delay us at least 2 months. John will have a better idea of schedule after his return from China in late February.

Crankshaft and Connecting Rods

SolidWorks models of the crankshaft and connecting rods have been provided and the instructions to the factory in China are to follow the SolidWorks models. The drawing looks good. Rolled fillets, balancing, hardening, bearing inserts, and the rear main seal was discussed in the previous update (26 Nov 2019). The crankshaft factory asked and was granted permission to have the connecting rods forged from steel instead of cast from malleable iron. We agreed as long as there would not be any increase in price. Preliminary drawings of the connecting rod have been marked up and returned to China.

Next Update and Other Comments

There have been no changes that will have an effect on pricing. The pricing goal is to provide these parts at a price that is competitive with the cost of machine work for the rebuild of a stock Model A engine. Regarding the schedule delay, please be patient and understand that hiccups can happen in any project. We have high standards and insist on quality even if it means a schedule delay. Our goal is to provide the parts that will allow an engine builder to provide a much better product that looks identical to stock on the exterior.

The next update will be in about 2 months.


